TRAINING ATTENDANCE POLICIES

- Only register for workshops you will attend. Early registration is recommended for all workshops.
- Any person with a disability requiring reasonable accommodations should call the training sponsor no later than seven (7) days prior to the training.
- Cancel your reservation (24 hours in advance when possible) if you find you will not be able to attend so that your space can be given to someone else.
- Check-in begins 30 minutes prior to the workshop. Workshops will begin and end on time. Come prepared with paper and pens/pencils for note-taking.
- **Workshops close 15 minutes after the start time. Arriving late will forfeit your registration.**

DIRECTIONS TO REGISTER ON-LINE:

1. Go to www.myflorida.com/childcare/training
2. From there click on "Register for Courses" button and click "continue".
3. The schedule is in alphabetical order by county. Scroll down to Pinellas County and click on "continue". Check the appropriate boxes for your desired classes, and follow the instructions given.
4. Registration Information will be displayed on the screen. If your information is already in the system, follow the directions on that page. If your information is not in the system, complete all the fields in red. If everything is correct and complete, click on the **submit** button.
5. Registration Information Check will be displayed on the screen. Check all information to make sure it is correct. A printed copy is not necessary. **Your space is not guaranteed until you have paid for the courses.** You may pay on-line at the end of registration with a credit card (if you put an e-mail address on your personal information you will receive a confirmation by e-mail) or go to the school location and pay for the class.
6. Print our your confirmation letter.
7. A copy must be placed in your children's center personnel file.

REMEMBER - Class sizes are limited and fill quickly. Your space is not guaranteed until payment is received.

COMPETENCY BASED TESTING

Children's Center Child Care Staff, Family Day Care and Large Family Child Care Home Providers

Students may register for exams after their first training session by going to www.myflorida.com/childcare/training, click on training and then click on "view my transcripts".

Individuals are allowed one opportunity, if they choose, to take the competency examination(s) as an exemption from enrollment in the child care training courses. **These individuals will not receive in-service training nor any CEUs for the course.** Students' transcripts will reflect this. Individuals that do not pass their exams will be required to enroll in the appropriate training classes. They will not be eligible to retake a competency exam until their course is completed. If you wish to register for competency exams without taking a course, call the Child Care Exam Scheduling Center toll free number, (888) 375-3926. This service is provided statewide between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday, excluding state holidays.

Exam Fees:

Exam fees are uniform statewide and are equivalent to \$1.00 per clock-hour of instructional time. For example: There is a \$6.00 exam fee for the 6-clock hour Behavioral Observation and Screening module. Fees are non-refundable. Students pay for each scheduled exam even if they fail to appear.

Scheduling Your Exam:

All students who enroll in a training course should schedule exams on-line at: www.myflorida.com/childcare/training and click on "View My Transcript". This can be done any time of the day. If there are any challenges with this process call Susan Weber, (727) 588-6343, at the Child Care Training Office in Pinellas County. Any student not enrolling in a course must register for an exam by calling (888) 375-3926.

Receiving Your Exam Results:

Within two weeks after completing an exam(s), individuals can obtain their exam results on-line by visiting the Child Care Training Website. Students will not receive test results or training certificates by mail. Students will be responsible for getting their results on-line and printing their transcript/certificates for their personnel file, which is monitored by License Board staff. Results can be obtained by logging onto: www.myflorida.com/childcare/training and clicking on "View My Transcript" and then printing a copy of their transcript.

<p>Record Keeping for Children's Centers is a two-day training (3 hours per day) comprised of an overview of record keeping regulations including personnel, children, and facility records. Participants will receive practical ideas for setting up and maintaining files in order to be in compliance with regulations. This training is appropriate for prospective or new owners/directors and as an update for current child care personnel with record keeping responsibilities. A certificate documenting six (6) hours of annual in-service training will be issued. Participants must attend the entire training to receive their certificate.</p> <p>REGISTRATION FEE: \$50.00 - Prepaid non-refundable registration fee is required prior to training. Telephone registration will not be accepted. COORDINATED CHILD CARE TRAINING

- ◆ **Beyond Centers and Circle Time**
 This series of trainings is for directors of centers and their preschool staff. This is a curriculum that provides a framework that can be used in conjunction with other curriculums or as a stand alone. It focuses on the following aspects of an early childhood classroom: planning of play experiences, scaffolding play, assessing play, organizing and arranging play, integrating knowledge of child development into play, infusing literacy experiences into the play. This series has already begun.
- ◆ **The Environment Rating Scales** (Attendees must be subcontracted with CCC.)
