1. General/Direct II. A.

- 1.1/II Child care staff failed to provide direct supervision of children in the () group of children as evidenced by ().
- 1.2/II Child care staff responsible for children in the outdoor play area failed to situate themselves so that all children could be observed as evidenced by ().
- 1.3/I Child care staff responsible for the supervision of school age children were not accountable for the children, even when they were separated from the group as evidenced by ().
- 1.4/II Child care staff lost track/were unaware of a () year old child in the bathroom; the child was observed ().
- 1.5/I The licensing specialist observed () while caring for children. The licensing specialist was in the classroom approximately () minutes before the staff person awoke/returned.
- 1.6/I Child care staff failed to keep a child, who was placed in isolation for illness, within direct supervision, as evidenced by ().
- 1.7/II The children's center did not provide an additional adult on a field trip away from the children's center as evidenced by ().

- 1.11/II There was not an additional person beyond the required adult-child ratio during evening hours to assist in providing direct supervision.

- 2.1/II Infants were observed combined with children two years of age and older as evidence by ().

The maximum group size of 6 infants for ages 2 months to 1 year was exceeded, in that a group of () infants were observed. ().

- 8.1/II 8. Swimming Pool/Areas: II. D., E.
The swimming pool was not enclosed by a fence or wall a minimum of six (6) feet high as evidenced by ().

- 8.3/II Children under 3 years of age were permitted in the pool area located at the center as evidenced by ().

17.5/II Child care staff failed to sign/date a log verifying that all children had left the premises as evidenced by ().

17.6/II Staff failed to verify attendance accuracy at transitions. ().

- 18.6/II Medication was not stored in a locked area or placed out of reach of children.
- 18.8/II The written medication record did not include the following information: the child's name, the name of the medication, date, time amount of dosage to be given, and signature of the custodial parent or legal guardian
- 18.12/III The children's center did not maintain a written record of medication dispensed for a minimum of one year.
- 18.15/II The licensing specialist observed medication, (), within reach of a child.
- 18.5/III Medication which had expired or was no longer being given remained at the children's center.
- 18.14/II The written medication record was not signed by the staff of the children's center who administered the medication.
- 18.3/I (S) A prescription/non-prescription medication, (), was not dispensed according to written directions on the prescription label or printed manufacturer's label as evidenced by ().
- 18.4/III Medication that was available with child resistant caps was observed without such caps.
- 18.9/II The children's center was notified of allergies to medication and failed to share the information with staff, put it in the child's file or post it with stored medication.
19. License Posted V. A.
19.1/III The official license of the children's center was not prominently displayed.
20. Administrative Fine Posted: V. A.
20.1/III The children's center did not post the following information with the license: The administrative fine(s) for a violation and a description of the corrective action for each administrative fine.
21. Accidents/Incidents V. A.
21.3/III The children's center failed to document accidents/incidents on the day of occurrence.
21.7/III The accidents and incidents records of the children's center were not maintained for one year.
21.5/III The accidents/incidents documentation of the children's center, dated (), did not include the following information: the name of the affected party, date and time of occurrence, description of occurrence, actions taken and by whom, signatures of children's center staff and parent signature.
22. Posted/Appropriate Activities: V. A.
22.3/III The plan of scheduled activities was not posted.

- 22.7/III The written plan of activities for the () group of children did not meet the needs of children for a balance of quiet and active play, both indoors and outdoors as evidenced by ().
- 22.2/III The posted schedule activities for the () group of children did not reflect the daily routine as evidenced by ().
- 22.4/III The plan of activities for the () group of children did not promote the children's emotional, social, intellectual, and physical growth, in that ().
- 22.5/III The children' center's plan of activities did not include appropriate physical activity or gross motor activities.
- 22.8/III The schedule for evening care did not include bedtime routines and person hygiene routines.
23. Written Plan (Infants) V. A.
- 23.1/III The children's center had no written plan for the care of infants. ().
- 23.2/III The children's center did not adjust the individualized written plan as the infant's developmental needs changed as evidenced by ().
- 23.3/III The children's center did not have an individualized written plan available for each infant up to 1 year of age; () infants were without a plan.
- 23.4/III Although the children's center had the written plan(s) for infants as required the plan was not followed as evidenced by ().
- 23.5/III The written plan(s) of the children's center did not have a balance of quiet and active experiences, in that ().
24. Written Report (Infants) V. A.
- 24.1/III The daily written report for infants was not accessible to parents ().
- 24.2/III The daily written report for infants did not include the following information: ().
- 24.3/III The children's center did not complete a daily written report for infants that was accessible to parents and included information concerning nutritional intake and times of meals, bowel movements, naps and changes in behavior
25. Field Trips V. A.
- 25.1/III The children's center did not advise parents in advance of a field trip.
- 25.2/III The date, time, an location of the field trip was not posted in a conspicuous location at least two working days prior to the trip.
- 25.3/II The children's center did not obtain either general or individual written parental permission for a field trip.
- 25.4/III The children's center did not maintain documentation of parental permission for a minimum of one year from the date of each field trip. Keep documentation of permission as required.
26. Emergency Plan/Diagram Posted V. A.
- 26.2/III The children's center failed to post an evacuation diagram for emergencies in () classroom(s).

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- 26.3/III Child care staff were unaware of the emergency plans to provide for the safety of the children.
- 26.4/III The emergency evacuation diagram(s) of the children's center did not state the location of children's emergency records.
- Physical Environment VI
27. Fire Inspection VI.B.
- 27.1/II The children's center had no proof of an approved annual fire inspection. Inspection was required as of ().
28. Telephone VI. B.
- 28.1/III Staff did not have immediate access to an operable corded telephone in the children's center. .
- 28.2/II The corded telephone of the children's center was not in service. ().
29. Fire Drills. VI. B.
- 29.2/II The children's center had not conducted a fire drill for the month(s) of ().
- 29.1/III The children's center failed to maintain a written record of monthly fire drills; there was no record that a fire drill had been conducted for the month(s) of () which included the following information: dates of the fire drills, number of children in attendance, and the time taken to evacuate the premises.
- 29.3/III The center operator did not maintain the record of drills for a minimum of one year.
- 29.7/III The fire drill record could not be located during the visit.
- 29.8/III Fire drills were not practiced at varying times monthly as evidenced by ().
- 29.2/II The classroom for teen parenting program did not have an outdoor exit and the schedule listing the parents who were scheduled for classes was not posted..
- 29.10/II The number of parents present (tpp program) for evacuating the building was insufficient to meet the required adult/child ratio: () persons were required and () persons were present.
- Indoor Play Space
30. Square Footage (Indoor) VI. C.
- 30.1.II The minimum of 25 square feet of usable floor space for each child was not met by this children's center which held a valid license on October 1, 1992. The () room has a capacity of () based on 25 square feet per child, and () children were observed in this classroom.
- 30.2/II The minimum of 35 square feet of usable floor space for each child was not met by this children's center which was licensed after October 1, 1992, or had a one year old children's classroom. The () room has a capacity of () children based on 35 square feet per child, and () children/infants were observed in the classroom.
- 30.3/III The children's center did not provide a space for infants that was available for floor play.

30.4/III The room capacity for the group of () INFANTS is based on 50 square feet per child as required for initial licensure after January 1, 1993. The room capacity was exceeded.

30.5/III The open play space for infants in the () area was insufficient for the developmental needs of the infants in care as evidenced by ().

31. Separate Room (Infants) VI.C.

31.1/III The () infant group was not provided a separate classroom with floor to ceiling walls. ().

31.2/III Staff in the () infant classroom failed to keep a door closed that lead to ().

32. Outdoor Exit (Infants) VI. C.

32.1/II A room used for the care of infants did no have an exit opening directly to the outdoors. ().

33. Diapering Area (Infants) VI. C.

33.1/II An infant room did not include a diapering area/diapering area did not contain a handwashing sink; infants were taken to a diapering area outside of the room.

33.3/III The hand washing sink in the () does not have hot/cold running water. ().

33.2/II The hot water at the hand-washing sink in the () exceeded 110 degree Fahrenheit. ().

34 Lighting VI. C.

34.1/III Lighting in the () was not adequate, in that (). Ensure that all rooms at all times have a minimum of 20 foot candles of light.

34.2/II Lighting was insufficient to visually observe and supervise children, including at naptime.

34.3/III All reading, painting, and other close work areas did not have lighting equivalent to 50 foot candles.

35. Temperature and Ventilation VI.C.

35.1/III The required inside temperature of 65 degrees to 82 degrees F. was not maintained at all times in that ().

35.2/III All rooms in the children's center were not adequately ventilated in that they ().

35.3/III Heavy cleaning of the room took place while children were in the room.

36. Clean Good Repair (Indoor Play Space) VI. C.

36.1/III The classroom(s) was/were not cleaned as evidence by ().

36.2/II Evidence of bugs/rodents was observed in the ().

36.3/III An area of the children's center was observed to not be in good repair: torn/unsanitary carpets/ wood deterioration/plaster crumbling/door handles broken/dirty or loose tiles, ().

36.4/II Broken glass within children's reach/broken or missing floorboards/holes in walls/peeling paint/ strong chemical odor in room with children were observed.

Outdoor Play Space

37. Square Footage (Outdoor) VI. D.

37.1/II The outdoor play space at the children's center, calculated at 90 square feet per child, allowed () children to use the space at one time, but () children were observed in the play area.

Summary/Level

- 37.2/II The outdoor play space at the children's center for infants through 4 months of age, calculated at 45 square feet per child, allowed () infants to use the space at one time but () infants were observed in the play area.
- 38.1/III 38. Clean/Free of Hazards (Outdoor Play Space): VI. D.
Debris, (), was found on the playground. ().
- 38.2/II The outdoor play area was not clean (broken glass/broken or missing floor boards/deck boards/cigarette butts/evidence of vermin).
- 38.3/II The children's center's outdoor play areas was observed to pose a threat to the health, safety or well-being of the children due to the presence of ().
- 39.1/II 39. Resilient Surface: VI. D.
The children's center does not have adequate ground cover, (), or other protective surface under the () to adequately reduce the incidence of injuries to children in the event of falls.
- 40.1/II 40. Adequate Fencing: VI. D.
The outdoor play space was not enclosed with fencing or walls a minimum of four feet high as evidenced by ().
- 40.2/I (S) The outdoor play area of the children's center was inadequately fenced to prevent children's access to a water hazard, a (). The fence was in disrepair as evidenced by ().
- 40.3/II The outdoor play area of the children's center was not adequately fenced, in that a gate on the playground was not secured while children were on the playground. ().
- 40.4/I The outdoor play area was not adequately fenced in that it had gaps that could allow children to exit the outdoor play area as evidenced by ().
- 40.5/I Fencing for the outdoor play area of the children's center had sharp edges that were exposed/was not at ground level and could allow access by children or animals or allow children to exit the play area.
- 40.6/II The children's center did not provide a separate fenced play area for infants under 2 years of age.
- 40.7/I The children's center was using an outdoor play area for infants that was not fenced.
- 40.8/III The school age center did not have an additional staff member present in the unfenced outdoor play area used for school age children. There were () school age children with only () staff member(s) in the outdoor play area..
- 40.9/II The fence in the outdoor play area had a dirt buildup at the base, causing the fence to be less than the minimum 4 feet in height, and could allow children to exit the play area.
- 41.1/III 41. Sun/Shade VI.D.
No Shade Available
Comments – The children's center had no shade available on the outdoor play area. (). Provide a shaded area.
- 42.1/III Napping Space
42. Napping Space VI. E.
During napping, the minimum spacing of two feet between cot/cribs used by children was not provided for. ().

Classification
Summary/Level

43. Exits Clear VI. E.
43.1/I The exit area in () was blocked off and inaccessible in an emergency.
43.2/II Exit areas were not clear in accordance with fire safety regulations.
44. SIDS Positioning (Infants)
44.1/II A young infant, not capable of rolling over, was not positioned on his/her back for napping to reduce the risk of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS)., and an alternative position was not authorized by a physician, as evidenced by ().
- Bathroom Facilities
45. Accessible/Operable VI. F.
45.1/III Toilets/sinks were not easily accessible and at a height usable by the children.
45.2/III Toilets/sinks were not usable because they were not maintained in working order.
46. Number/Location (Bathrooms) VI. F.
46.1/III The children's center did not provide at least 1 sink/1 toilet for every 18 children. There were () sinks and () toilets available for use. ().
46.2/III Toilet facilities in the () area opened directly into an area where food was prepared. ().
46.3/III The children's center had neither a portable or permanent bath facility available for bathing children.
46.4/II A bathroom adjoining an infant room was shared with preschool children.
46.5/III The school age center did not provide the required number of sinks/toilets, in that two sinks and two toilets are needed for the first 30 children and on additional sink and toilet for every thirty children thereafter; () sinks/toilets were needed and the school age center had only () sinks and () toilets.
47. Bathroom Supplies VI.F.
47.1/III Running water was not available in the () handwashing area.
47.2/III Toilet paper was not available in the toileting area.
47.3/III Disposable towels or hand drying machines were not available in the () handwashing area.
47.4/III Soap was not available in the () handwashing area.
47.5/III A trash receptacle was not available in the () handwashing area.
48. Cleaned/Sanitized (Bathroom) VI.F.
48.1/III The children's center had no system in place for ensuring that basins and toilets were sanitized as needed and at least daily.
48.2/II The children's center did not adequately keep the toilet and bath facilities used by the children clean and sanitized posing a threat to the health, safety or well-being of the children.
48.3/III Potty chairs were not cleaned and sanitized after each use. ().
48.4/II The cleaning and sanitizing of potty chairs did not take place between use by different children, posing a threat to the health, safety or well-being of the children.

Outdoor Equipment

49. Quantity/Appropriate (Outdoor Equipment) VI. G.

49.1/III The children's center did not have enough equipment for the number of children on the playground as evidenced by ().

49.2/III The children's center did not provide age appropriate/developmentally appropriate outdoor equipment for the () age group, in that ().

50. Maintained/Safe (Outdoor Equipment) VI.G.

50.1/III The frame of the () was not securely anchored to the ground.

50.2/III Playground equipment that is stationary by design did not have ground cover that is resilient under the equipment.

50.3/II The play equipment (), was not safe for the children to use in that ().

50.4/II Sharp edges were exposed on the ().

50.5/II Standing water was found in, equipment (), on the playground.

50.6/III The placement of () did not allow for adequate distance/clearance from other equipment or children in the area.

Indoor Equipment

51. Quantity/Appropriate

51.1/III Toys/equipment/furnishings as follows were not age/developmentally appropriate for the () age group: ().

51.2/III The quantity of toys, equipment and/or furnishings suitable to each child's age and development was inadequate for the number of children in care in that there was not enough art, music, creative expression materials/science and math materials/shelving available/children's storage space available/easel available/tables and chairs/home living accessories/construction and play materials/early literacy and language materials/school age materials.

51.3/III Materials did not reflect diversity in a representative and respectful manner as evidenced by ().

51.4/III The children's center lacked suitable/an adequate amount of infant toys. Provide suitable toys such as mobiles, soft toys, push/pull toys, mirrors, books, dolls and blocks.

52. Maintained/Safe

52.1/III Toys/equipment/or furnishings were not safe in that ().

52.2/II Toys/equipment/or furnishing, were dirty/inoperable/not safe and posed a threat to the health, safety or well-being of the children in care in that they ().

53. Napping Equipment

53.1/III Bedding in the () area was not stored in a sanitary manner as evidenced by cot sheets touching when stored.

53.2/II Cots appeared to be dirty, and posed a threat to the health, safety and/or well-being of children.

- 53.3/III The children's center did not have an adequate number of cots/cribs for the children in care; () cots/cribs were available and () were needed.
- 53.4/II Cots in use need repair in that observations as follows were made: ().
